

Community Supports Coordinators

Community Support Coordinators are PDD Central Region staff who can help adults with a developmental disability, or their parents or guardians.

Community Support Coordinators can:

- Provide information about the PDD program
- Determine Eligibility for PDD supports
- Assess individual/family desires
- Provide information about Person Centered Planning, Individual Service Planning, and funding
- Provide information about living and working in the community
- Provide individual personal support
- Provide public awareness and education

Community Supports Coordinators act within philosophical and values base that includes:

- All individuals are valued members of society
- People with developmental disabilities have a right to enjoy the opportunities and privileges of citizenship available to all Albertans
- Individuals will have the opportunity to exercise choice about where they live and what they want to do in their lives
- People with developmental disabilities will be involved in designing, planning and evaluating their supports.

Community Supports Coordinators are knowledgeable about the local community and the resources, supports, and programs that are available to assist adults with developmental disabilities and their families.

They also focus on developing and arranging funding from the *Persons with Developmental Disabilities (PDD)* program to support persons with developmental disabilities.
